

Stop an Overdose SAVE A LIFE

If you or someone you know uses opioids (such as heroin or prescription pain medications), please ask our emergency department staff for information on how to get a lifesaving naloxone kit.

When a person overdoses on opioids, they stop breathing. Naloxone reverses the overdose, allowing the victim to breathe again. It is a safe antidote for opioid overdose, and does not harm the person if they have not taken opioids.

A person may be having an opioid overdose if they:

- Are known to use opioids
- Will not wake up, even when you shake them
- Are breathing slowly or not at all
- Have lips or fingernails that are blue or gray-colored
- Have clammy or pale skin

IF YOU SEE THESE SIGNS, IT MAY BE AN OPIOID OVERDOSE!
